 - o Stress Management Workbooks, Mental Health & Wellness Week
- Describe The Event
 - O University Health Services (UHS) approached ARHS hoping to gain funding for the printing of 300 copies of a stress management workbook. An equivalent amount of funding would also be given by UPUA in support of the initiative. Recognition would also be given to the organizations in the workbook saying that we helped fund it. The workbooks are based off of a version designed by the Veteran's Association and are tailored specifically for college students at Penn State.
- History of Event
 - o These workbooks were initially given last year to students in their first year seminar classes. There was a large positive response about the effectiveness and quality of the workbooks and more demand is expected this year.
- How will this event benefit on campus students?
 - o Stress is one of the most pervasive mental health issues faced by college students on a daily basis. These workbooks are professionally designed to help students effectively manage their stress and to live happier, mentally healthier lives.
