 - Movin' On is the annual, free music festival happening on the last day of classes of the spring semester. This year the festival will take place on April 26th, 2019; approximately from 3-10:30 p.m. (or all day event) at the IM fields
- Describe The Event
 - Movin' On is Penn State's annual, free music festival happening on the last day of classes of the spring semester. It is one of the largest student-run music festivals in the country. Each year, students work hard throughout the year to promote a free music festival for the student body. The festival promotes a substance-free atmosphere and tries to provide a fun experience filled with good music and field activities.
- History of Event
 - Movin' On came to life in the year of 1975 and actually started as an ARHS event. Movin' On works in collaboration with ARHS and 3 other organizations- UPUA, GPSA, and SPA. Before 2010, all four of these organizations held their own spring concerts, but the students wanted one huge festival to be an all-day event. In the fall of 2010 and with the help of UPAC, Movin' On was born as itself and is funded through the Penn State student activity fee. It has combined forces with these four organizations to put on a fun day with diverse music acts, promote being substance-free, and have fun activities on the field. Past musical acts include Big Sean, Walk the Moon, All Time Low, Fall Out Boy, Passion Pit, MGMT, and Nelly.
- How will this event benefit on campus students?
 - Movin' On is a free event for students promoting a substance-free atmosphere. It's a day where they can celebrate the last day of classes for the year, be substance-free, and

spend time listening to great music with their friends. It's also a fun celebration intended to congratulate graduating seniors that are "movin' on" with their lives outside of Penn State.

 - The funding from ARHS will be used for all of Movin' On's marketing. This marketing includes all merchandise, advertising materials (banners on the top and sides of the stage), social media promotion, our website, and and signage. Without the funding from ARHS, Movin' On has no marketing materials to promote a free and substance-free event to students. Last year, Movin' On requested \$5,000 from ARHS for marketing and received full funding, but we ended up spending about \$7,000 for marketing materials. (We used the full \$5,000 from ARHS and the rest was used from our merchandise sales and fundraising)
